Cirencester

Cirencester is a charming market town with a fascinating history. In Roman times it was the second largest town after London. During the medieval period it became a prosperous wool town. With its honey coloured stone buildings and picturesque narrow streets, it a great place to explore. It has a central Market Place, and many interesting shops and cafes. The surrounding countryside, known as the Cotswolds, provides a beautiful setting.

Some of what Cirencester and the area have to offer:

- Historic narrow streets to explore, including the stunning Church of St John Baptist
- Beautiful surrounding countryside
- Cirencester Park: Earl Bathurst's 3,000 acre estate
- Two indoor swimming pools and an outdoor heated pool
- The Corinium Museum, full of Roman artefacts and a Roman Amphitheatre



Royal Agricultural University

Our course takes place at Royal Agricultural University, It is the smallest university in the UK but has excellent grounds, buildings and facilities, mixing modern and traditional styles. There are plenty of spacious break-out areas to relax in.




Residential Accommodation

Medical Care & Wellbeing



Cirencester has a Hospital, a 10 minute drive away, as well as a walk in centre.

There is a local pharmacy nearby if students require medication or advice.. Students must hand all medication to their group leader or the Elac Welfare Officer who will then administer it when required.

A First Aid box is kept in the Elac office and basic kits are taken on all excursions. There are First Aiders on site and Elac also has Mental Health First Aiders in Head Office if needed.

Safety & Security



- There is CCTV in most external areas around the campus and the accommodation
- Accommodation building access is mostly by electronic key cards (or fobs). A spare is held by our Welfare and Accommodation manager for emergency access.
- Room access is also mostly by key card (or fobs) with some by physical key which again a spare is held by our Manager
- Physical security patrols are done in the evenings and at night by RAU campus security and we are in close communication with them if necessary.
- There is a 24/7 reception/porters lodge in case of any outside hours emergencies as well as our own 24/7 emergency number.

Students must lock all windows on leaving their accommodation and follow security procedures explained on arrival

When out and about, we will explain to students how they can keep themselves and their belongings safe.




*Individuals who have booked a shared transfer, may have to wait at the airport for up to 2.5 hours before being taken to the centre.

On the first full day of the programme students will:


- have a welcome meeting with the Centre Manager,

- Group leaders explain safety procedures to students in their own language.






Mobile Phones

- All mobile phones must be put on silent and placed in the box provided at the front of the classroom at the start of every lesson.

- Staff may confiscate phones if rules are not followed.

Noise

- Students must keep noise to a minimum when returning to their accommodation
- Curfew is 10pm.



Damages & Replacements

The school imposes the above call-out charges for deliberate acts of misuse. Costs for other damages will be handled on a case-by-case basis.






Smoking, Drugs, Alcohol & Vaping


